

# William Banton Clarkson and Alice Ann Peaple

FINDINGS C01–C08 • public research review, not an assertion that every proposed edit is proved

**Clarkson Family: Research Findings and Evidence.** This report explains proposed corrections and remaining uncertainties in historical family-tree entries. Finding IDs match the full family editing packet; living-family navigation and private links have been removed.

**Confirmed:** direct support within the stated scope. **Likely:** coherent but incomplete support. **Unconfirmed / note only:** unresolved. **Check and detach** describe proposed actions, not additional confidence levels.

**C01 : CONFIRMED:** Set/check William Banton Clarkson's birth to **8 May 1858, Liverpool, England**, citing the saved passport/baptism evidence.

**C02 : CONFIRMED:** Add/check baptism **22 June 1858, All Saints, Liverpool**, entry **989**, naming parents **William and Emma Lucy Clarkson**. Birth and baptism are separate events.

**C03 : LIKELY:** Check his marriage to Alice Ann in the **December quarter of 1883, Prestwich registration district**. Do not invent a precise ceremony date or imply the paid certificate has been obtained.

**C04 : LIKELY:** Correct his wife “Alice A.” to researched **Alice Ann Peaple**; retain later surname variants **Peal, People or Peoples** as alternates rather than separate people.

**C05 : LIKELY:** Add/check Alice's birth **7 June 1859**, proposed Highworth/Swindon area, Wiltshire, with the headstone/index qualification. Do not present the broad registration geography as an exact birthplace.

**C06 : NOTE ONLY:** For Alice's proposed relatives labelled “John Peal” or “Thomas People,” record the supported surname spelling **Peaple**, but do not confirm their given names, identities or parental roles from spelling alone.

**C07 : CHECK/LIKELY:** Retain William Banton's **8 September 1933** death if the attached evidence matches the saved research. Do not use his father's 1915 Liverpool burial for him.

**C08 : LIKELY:** Add researched residence chronology only at supported precision: Texas by roughly **1886–88**, Houston around **1897–1904**, then San Antonio. The naturalization record was identified but not read; do not invent an exact arrival date.

I solemnly swear that I was born at Liverpool, England on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1858; that my father, William Clarkson, was born in England and is now living and dead; that I emigrated to the United States, sailing from London, England about February, 1884; that I resided 37 years, uninterruptedly, in the United States, from 1884 to 1921 at San Antonio, Texas; that I was naturalized as a citizen of the United States before the Judge of the County Court of Brewer County at San Antonio, Texas on 14<sup>th</sup> of September, 1906, as shown by the Certificate of Naturalization presented herewith; that I am the IDENTICAL PERSON described in said Certificate; that I have resided outside the United States since my naturalization at the following places for the following periods:  
Liverpool, England from March to July 1919  
do from April to July 1920

and that I am domiciled in the United States, my permanent residence being at San Antonio in the State of Texas, where I follow the occupation of Cotton Shipper. My last passport was obtained from Department of State, Washington, D. C. on 26<sup>th</sup> February 1920 and was renewed herewith. I am about six months with the purpose of residing and performing the duties of citizenship therein; and I desire a passport for use in visiting the countries hereinafter named for the following purpose:  
England (Name of country.) Arrange for shipment of cotton (Object of visit.)  
France (Name of country.) do (Object of visit.)  
Italy (Name of country.) do (Object of visit.)

I intend to leave the United States from the port of New York sailing on board the ss. Caronia on April 30<sup>th</sup>, 1921.

OATH OF ALLEGIANCE.  
Further, I do solemnly swear that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; and that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion: So help me God.

**Scope:** C01 and C08: applicant's birth statement and retrospective migration account.

The application reports departure from London about February 1884 and naturalization on 14 September 1906. The underlying passenger list and court decree are not reproduced or independently checked; do not confuse intent to travel in 1921 with completed travel. The link opens the public source guide, not the original record; a verified public item URL was not retained.

# William and Alice Clarkson's children

FINDINGS C09–C13 • public research review, not an assertion that every proposed edit is proved

**Confirmed:** direct support within the stated scope. **Likely:** coherent but incomplete support. **Unconfirmed / note only:** unresolved. **Check and detach** describe proposed actions, not additional confidence levels.

**C09 : LIKELY:** Check/add **Florence Clarkson (1886–1964)**, married **Frederick C. Groos in 1907**.

**C10 : LIKELY with date conflict:** Check/add **Dora Clarkson**, married **Hilmer G. Guenther in 1909**. Keep the proposed birth about **1887** versus the stone's **1877** as a conflict, not an automatic correction.

**C11 : LIKELY:** Check/add **Alice Clarkson (1889–1960)**, married surname **Cade**, avoiding confusion with her mother Alice Ann.

**C12 : LIKELY:** Check/add **Percy W. Clarkson (1893–1962)**. Attach documented military titles to their source rather than infer them from a same-name tree.

**C13 : NOTE ONLY:** Preserve the suggestion that Herbert's middle name Slayden relates to the business partner/congressman as a hypothesis. No inspected record states the child was named for him.

# William Clarkson and Emma Lucy Green

FINDINGS C14–C22 • public research review, not an assertion that every proposed edit is proved

**Confirmed:** direct support within the stated scope. **Likely:** coherent but incomplete support. **Unconfirmed / note only:** unresolved. **Check and detach** describe proposed actions, not additional confidence levels.

**C14 : CONFIRMED:** Correct William Banton's mother from “**Eliza L. Clarkson**” to **Emma Lucy Green**, using the 1854 marriage and 1858 baptism. Keep “Eliza L.” as the prior tree assertion, not a second wife/person.

**C15 : CONFIRMED:** Add/check marriage **6 July 1854, St Paul's, Liverpool** between **William Clarkson** and **Emma Lucy Green**.

**C16 : CONFIRMED identities:** Check the marriage record's fathers: **Thomas Clarkson**, described as a brewer, and **William Green**, described as a builder. Do not demand death certificates to retain these historical relationships.

**C17 : LIKELY:** Correct William Clarkson's death location from **Texas** to **Liverpool** and add burial **13 February 1915, Allerton Cemetery**. Burial date is not automatically death date.

**C18 : NOTE ONLY for birth precision:** Retain William's birth range **about 1830–33**. The proposed 7 February 1830 baptism is not automatically his exact birth.

**C19 : CONFIRMED visit, not migration:** Add the **1901 Houston visit** to his son if useful, citing the saved \*Houston Daily Post\*, **29 May 1901**. Do not convert a visit into permanent residence or Texas death.

**C20 : LIKELY:** Add/check Emma Lucy's death in the **October–December quarter of 1910, Toxteth Park, Liverpool**, aged 74. Do not fabricate a day.

**C21 : LIKELY:** Check/add other children **Robert Banton Clarkson (born 1861)**, **Herbert Green Clarkson (born 1864)** and **Thomas M. Clarkson**, using the saved census/baptism evidence.

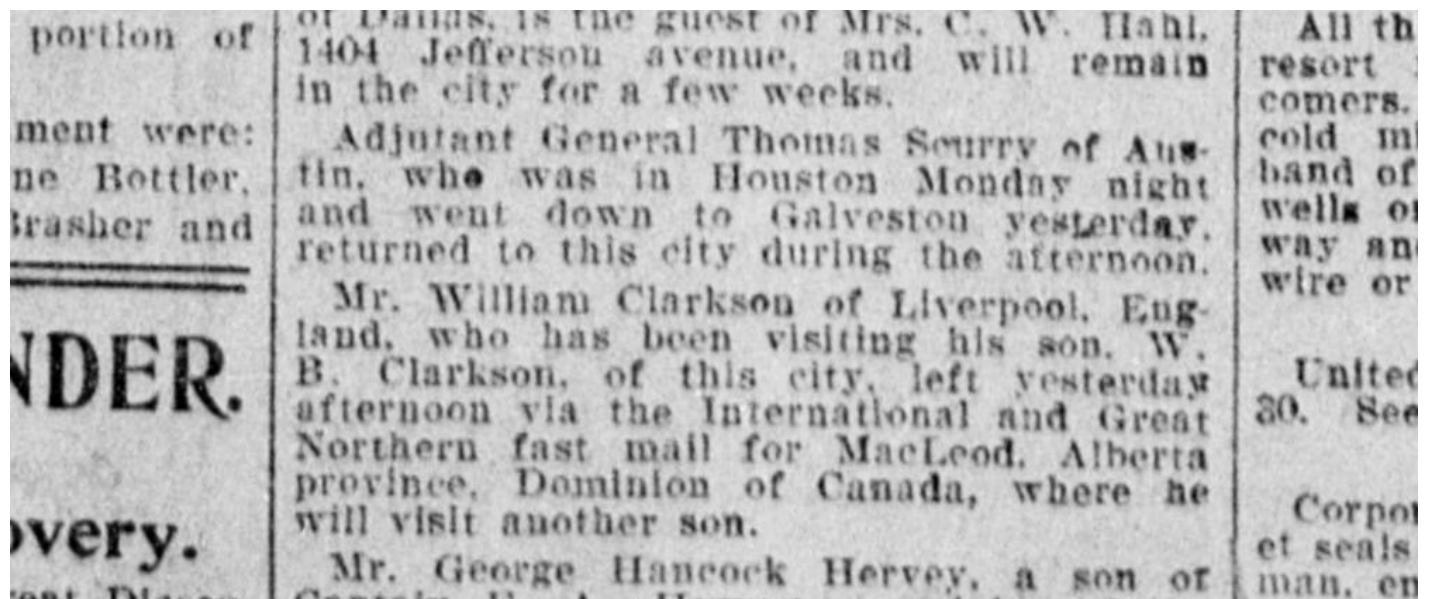
**C22 : NOTE ONLY:** Do not automatically merge the existing tree child “**Geor R Clarkson**” with Robert Banton. The later reconciliation explicitly left that near-match unresolved.

**C23 : LIKELY:** Add/check marriage **1 February 1827, St Chad's, Poulton-le-Fylde**, between Thomas Clarkson and Nancy Banton, with the transcription-level qualification.

**C24 : CHECK:** Keep Thomas's identity distinct from the abolitionist Thomas Clarkson. Do not copy the abolitionist's parents, dates or life story.

**C25 : NOTE ONLY:** Do not retain the **1834 burial** as a confirmed death without resolving the identity. The later marriage record names an occupation but does not by itself prove Thomas was alive in 1854 either.

**C26 : LIKELY:** Add/check Nancy's birth **27 November 1806, Ellel**, baptism at Cockerham, with parents **Robert Banton** and **Nancy Moor**.

**C27 : LIKELY:** If adding those parents, attach the saved **1804 marriage** support rather than inferring their marriage date from Nancy's birth.

**C28 : NOTE ONLY:** Remove the unsupported **1887** death from confirmed/preferred certainty only after recording why it may concern the York-born Scarborough namesake. Keep the proposed **Oldham, December quarter 1889, age 82** as untested, not a replacement fact.

**C29 : CONFIRMED:** Keep **William Green, builder**, as Emma Lucy's father, supported by her 1854 marriage record.

**C30 : NOTE ONLY:** Keep the proposed Hoddesdon/Hertfordshire origin and carpenter identification as possible, not an established birthplace.

**C31 : NOTE ONLY/LIKELY proposal:** Preserve **Mary Ann Waller** as the proposed mother, based on the likely Broxbourne baptism and William Green's 1833 marriage. Do not state that the identification is proved.

**C32 : CHECK, then detach only if the rejection applies to the exact link:** The old **Sarah (1805–1845)** assignment may concern another William Green's wife. Preserve the rejection evidence; do not simply rename Sarah into Mary Ann or merge the two women.

**C33 : LIKELY:** Correct/record “Nathaniel Nat E. Ligon” as researched **Emmons Nathaniel “E. Nat” Ligon**, retaining the known name variants.

**C34 : LIKELY:** Add/check **1 September 1888, Gloster, Mississippi – 1 March 1922, Tulsa, Oklahoma**, burial **Rose Hill**, and legal education/occupation only with the saved sources.

**C35 : LIKELY:** For his father, check death **6 November 1929, Gloster, Mississippi**. Do not use the Navarro County, Texas record for the other William Orlando Ligon.

**C36 : NOTE ONLY:** Preserve the father's competing birth years **1840, 1846 or about 1847–48**; the headstone and later records disagree. Do not “fix” all sources to a single unsupported year.

**C37 : LIKELY:** Record birth **near Baton Rouge, Louisiana** as reported by his son's death certificate, with the informant/source qualification rather than silently treating it as a birth record.

**C38 : LIKELY:** Add/check first wife **Cathella Elizabeth “Bessie” Davis**, married **1875**, died **1878**, as a separate marriage from Jennie.

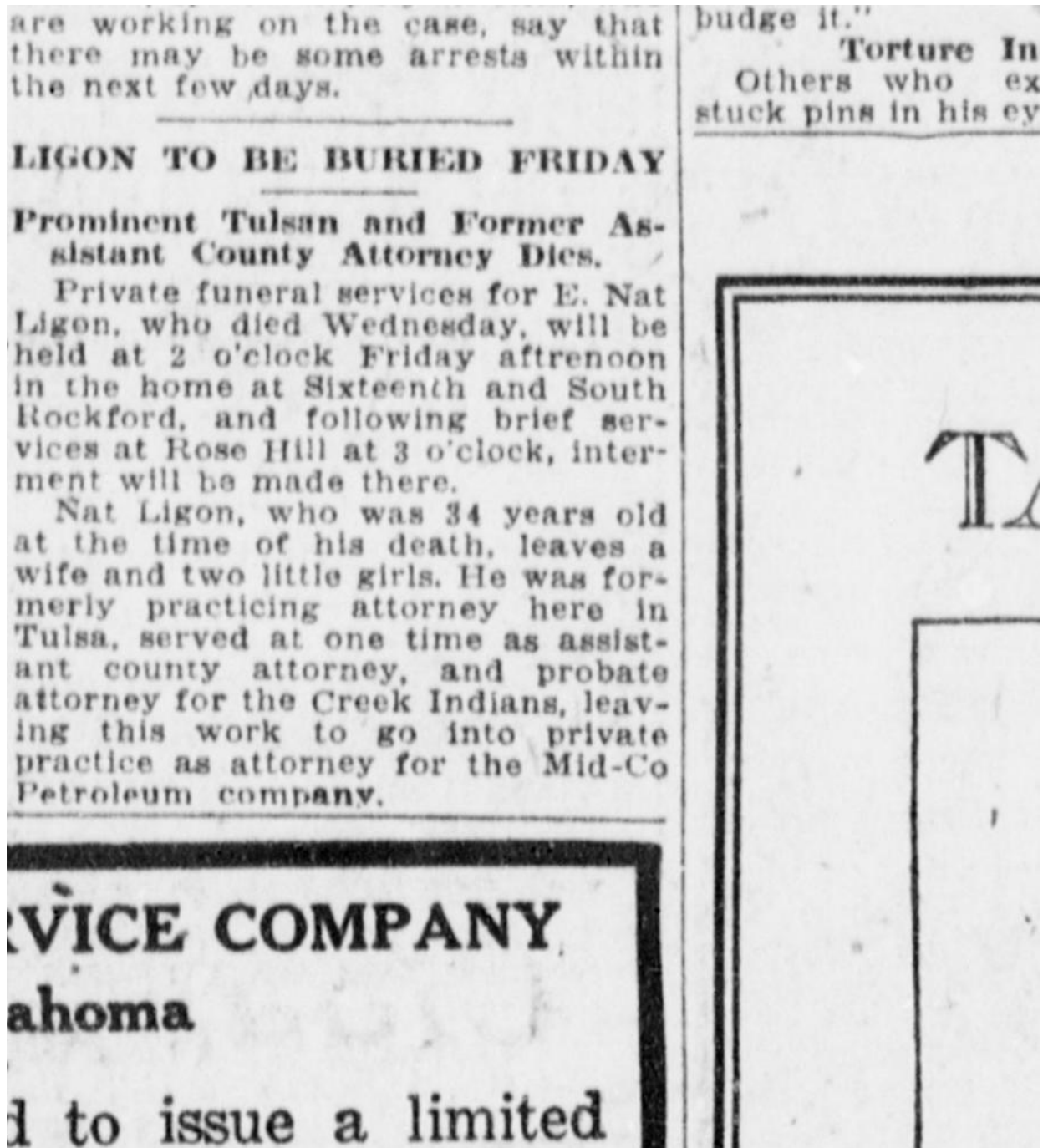
**C39 : LIKELY:** Check/add their son **Lattimore Bryant Ligon (1877–1957)** as the older half-brother in the first marriage, not automatically as Jennie's son.

**C40 : LIKELY:** Use **Jennie D. Faust** as a conservative researched name. Keep **Davis** as a reported middle name from her son's certificate, not an unquestioned birth-record fact; “Jane?” is also unresolved.
